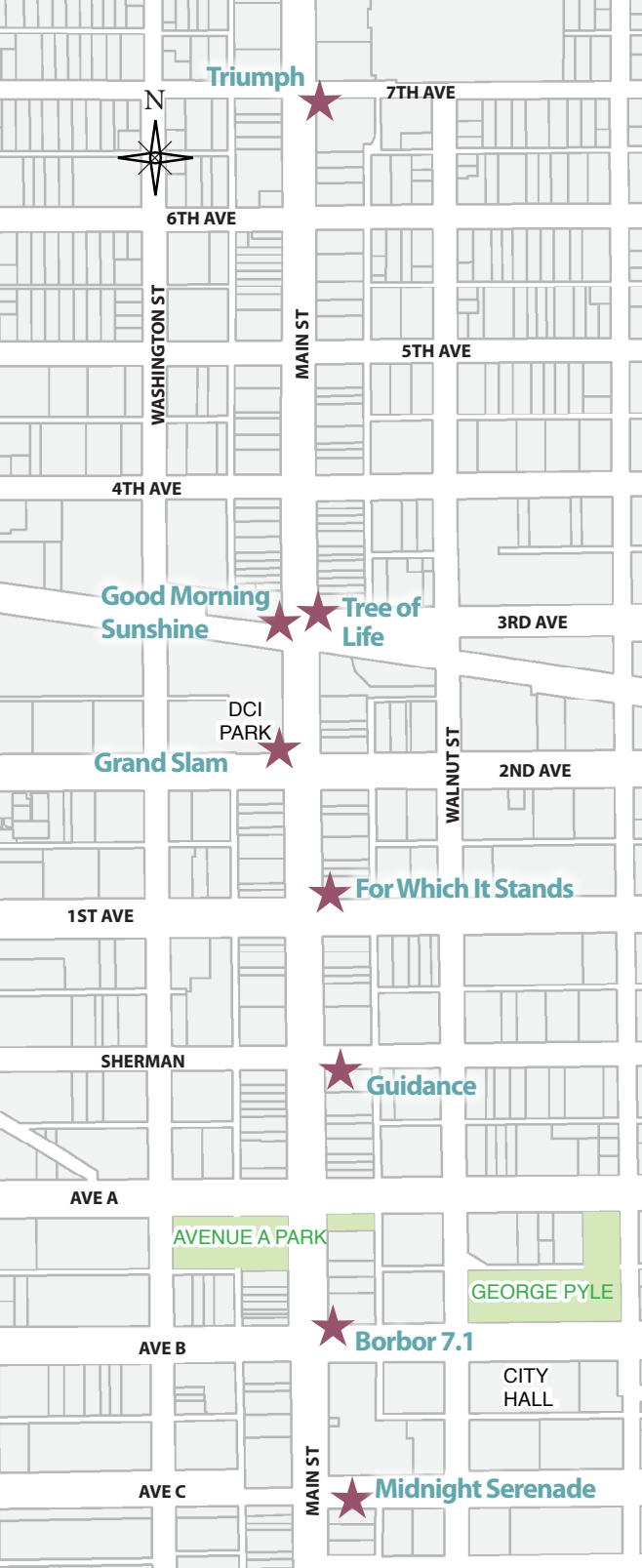

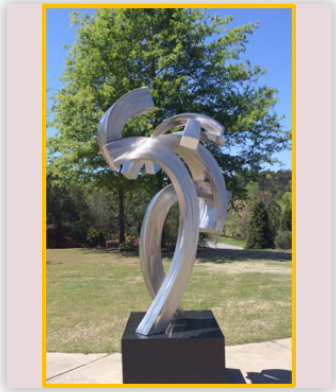

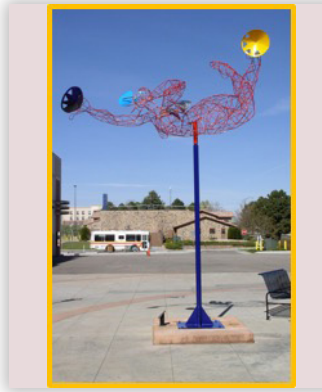




Triumph
