Maintain 6 foot social distance.



EMPLOYERS

Employers may begin reducing teleworking and start bringing employees back to work in an office setting.

Any employee exhibiting symptoms should be required to stay home.



TRAVEL

Nonessential travel may resume.

Follow KDHE travel and quarantine guidelines for travel to high-risk areas.

City Council meetings open to the public while continuing to observe social distancing guidelines and good hygiene. Meetings still broadcast via YouTube, Facebook and Channel 7.



EMPLOYEES

Employees return to on-site staffing and regular work schedules as determined by department heads and city manager.

Observe social distancing guidelines and good hygiene. Masks may be worn by those who choose.

Any employee exhibiting symptoms required to stay home.

All non-essential travel canceled

Workspaces arranged to allow for 6ft social distancing requirements.

Plexiglas shields being installed at front counters.

Masks to be provided for employees who want them.

Public encouraged to use online options when possible for paying bills, applying for permits, etc.
